Clarabelle the Cow Returns for Charity Auction at Brunswick Show

She's back! The Brunswick Show's most loveable bovine, Clarabelle the Cow, will once again take centre stage in 2025 for the annual Clarabelle Charity Auction.

Each year, Clarabelle captures hearts as she's auctioned off to raise vital funds for a charitable causes. This year, proceeds from the auction will go towards supporting groundbreaking research into Healthy Ageing conducted by the Health Futures Institute at Murdoch University, making every bid count for the community.

Brunswick Show President, David Power, said the Clarabelle Auction has become one of the Show's most cherished traditions.

"Clarabelle isn't just a crowd favourite — she symbolises the community spirit of the Brunswick Show. Every bid helps us give back and support a worthy cause, and we're always amazed by the generosity of our community."

The initiative, led by the Centre for Healthy Ageing, explores why some Australians aged 80 and above are able to maintain strong cognitive health despite common risk factors for dementia and Alzheimer's disease. The project, titled "Investigating resilience to age-related decline in cognition and function in Australia's oldest old: The 80+ Study", is spearheaded by Lead Investigator Professor Hamid Sohrabi. Researchers hope to uncover the biological, psychological, and lifestyle factors that protect against decline, paving the way for future prevention strategies and improved quality of life for older adults.

Brunswick Agricultural Society President David Power said the cause was one that would resonate across the community. "Almost every family has been touched in some way by dementia or agerelated decline. By supporting this research, the Brunswick Show is helping to shine a light on work that could change the future for older Australians," he said.

The Clarabelle Auction will take place at 2:00pm in the Main Arena, where crowds gather to cheer, bid, and celebrate the joy of giving.

The auction is part of a huge day of entertainment, including the Battle of the Butchers, agricultural competitions, motocross shows, cultural dance performances, working sheep dogs, sideshow alley, and the spectacular evening finale of the Alcoa and Lotterywest Drone Show followed by the South32 Fireworks.
